Marnie Maraldo is WSSDA's Next President-Elect

Marnie Maraldo, a member of the Issaquah School Board, has been elected as the next president-elect of the Washington State School Directors' Association.

Maraldo was chosen in a month-long online election. School board members from across the state participated in the voting.



“We are very fortunate to have Marnie as our next president-elect,” said WSSDA Executive Director Tim Garchow. “She has a breadth of experience, not just at the local level but on the association’s board, legislative committee, and as vice president.”

Maraldo has served on the Issaquah board for seven years. She is WSSDA vice president and sits on the board of directors. She formerly served on WSSDA’s Legislative Committee. She has also contributed in the areas of federal relations, education for students with disabilities, and gifted and talented programs. She is coordinator for Eastside Human Services Forum.

Maraldo will assume office as president-elect during the closing session of the WSSDA Annual Conference this November and will serve for a year with Joanne Greer of Deer Park, who is slated to become president.

School directors from all of the state’s 295 public school districts were eligible to cast ballots in the election, which closed October 14.

The new officers will be introduced and sworn into office at the closing general session November 19.
